# Dear Readers

At the time of writing this, we are about to move from our Vicarage in Wales, so it is with a sense of excitement and trepidation that we are preparing to move half-way across the country to begin a new chapter with you all in the West Wycombe Benefice. I am due to be licensed as the new Rector of the Benefice by Bishop Steven on the 1st December in St Paul's Church in Bledlow Ridge.

I'm sure that after such a long interregnum, people are interested to know just a little about me and my experience in ministry and my family. My name is Lance Sharpe, I'm 56 years old and have been married to Alison for 31 years. We have three adult children, Josh (27), Abi (25) and Michael (22). Our daughter, Abi has two children of her own, Charlotte (7) and Ellie (5). As you'll tell from my accent, I grew up in the Midlands near the town of Cannock in South Staffordshire just 10 miles from the City of Wolverhampton and the large town of Walsall. Alison grew up in Hemel Hempstead and her parents now live in Chesham, which is one of the reasons we wanted to move to Buckinghamshire, so we were nearer to them.

I've been in Christian ministry, both stipendiary and self-supporting, both lay and ordained for about 25 years and have worked as a hospital chaplain for nearly ten years before moving into rural parish ministry. I was originally a Pentecostal minister before being introduced to the Anglican liturgy as a chaplain, which led me on a journey becoming an Anglican in October 2016. I was ordained Deacon in November 2016 in Morriston Hospital Chapel in Swansea and then ordained Priest in 2017 in Brecon Cathedral. I continued

as the Senior Chaplain in Swansea until 2019 when I moved to become a Priest in the West Radnor Ministry Area in the small town of Rhayader in the Diocese of Swansea and Brecon, and then latterly in the village of Newbridge-on-Wye just 8 miles to the south of Rhayader.

I'm the sort of person that notices connections, so coming from the Upper Wye Valley in Wales, I see the Wycombe itself means 'Wye valley' albeit a different River Wye! Then, it's from one Wye valley to another to work with the congregations in the benefice in the service of Christ to our communities. We're coming in a special time of year that we call 'Advent' when Anglicans prepare themselves for Christmas and the celebration of the incarnation of God himself in the person of Jesus.

With lots of services planned over Advent and Christmas, you'd be most welcome to join us in worship. You'll find the schedule in the magazine and we both look forward to meeting you all and getting to know you.

May you have a blessed Advent, Christmas and New Year.

The trophy went to 14 year-old Nevin Korala who broke into the Ist XI after a series of strong performances for the 2nd XI, took four wickets on his debut and deservedly kept his place for the rest of the season. Jonah Pedrette received a trophy for his debut club century while Freddie Grimmett and Josh Brooks were each awarded a trophy for their debut "five wickets in a match".

Chairman Dave Wells thanked various people who had contributed to the club off the pitch in many ways, including our umpires and scorers and in particular Humphrey Grimmett who was the main committee's unanimous choice as Clubman of the Year for contributions too many to mention. With four cricketing sons of whom Freddie mentioned above is the oldest, his association with the club is assured for a good while yet. Of equal significance were the awards of Life Membership to two legendary figures Martin Harris and Rik Dryden, whose many services have included between them: raising, managing and captaining teams, running the Junior section and its related tournaments, preparing pitches, arranging fixtures, umpiring, scoring and running quizzes. 
In recent previous articles we have mentioned three major projects, namely to improve the car park, to upgrade ground machinery and to replace the outdoor nets. These are slowly beginning to take


come and experience the atmosphere and delicious refreshments for yourself.

### **Notes From The Parish Council**



The Council discussed the readiness of the village to adjust to changing weather patterns and noticed once again, that the roads around the village, especially on the A4010, is frequently flooded. It was suggested that BCC be contacted again to ask if the drains along Bradenham Woods Lane, could be cleared. Some years ago, local subscription re-created the village pond, but with each passing year, silt from the road is filling up the pond, which has to then be cleared by local volunteers. It was noted that the sump at the pond end of the drain had never been properly maintained by the council.

The Council also discussed the problem of over-growing hedges along the pavements in the village and contact will be made with the relevant authorities to cut them back. so pedestrians can walk along them in the dark winter nights.

will need to take priority. We retain the desire to re-surface the main hall floor but the affordability of that refurbishment in the face of more pressing matters is a recurring issue. We remain most grateful to Maureen Muschallik for her sterling work as our Treasurer, and for her continued oversight of the regular users of the hall and its cleanliness. Following last year's appeal for additional members to join the Hall committee, it has been a pleasure to welcome the new members whose energy and initiative has helped to make this a very active and successful year for events within the hall and its overall administration. The increase in the size of the committee has enabled us to meet the terms of the covenant that governs the running of the hall, whilst at the same time helping to spread the load. Their achievements have been most notable, and it will be a pleasant challenge to build upon this year's successes

next year. As Chair of the committee, my heartfelt thanks therefore must go to my other fellow committee members for their efforts over the past year and for their willingness to continue to do so.

In addition to the sad loss of one key member of our team earlier in the year, it is inevitable that a number of colleagues will be stepping down or back from their roles in the coming year. Indeed, the Charity Commission recommends a maximum service of around 9 years for trustees to ensure a regular refresh of talent. Some of us have driven a coach and horses through that guideline but it is a challenge in such a small community to maintain committee membership at the levels required and it is so important that we do. Simon Digby is stepping down from the committee after some 30 years as a former Chair and member, and a huge vote of thanks must go to Simon for all that he has done for the Hall in that time: he has been a stalwart who will be sorely missed from the committee. After many years as Secretary, Ann Ferguson will be handing over the reins but will stay on the committee to help guide those who follow her in the role as we have decided to rotate the duties of Secretary to both spread the workload and to give some members experience of the duties involved. Maureen Muschallik will be supported as Treasurer by Agnes Gill, who after a transition period will take on the role in full. We are delighted to welcome Val Maylor as a new committee member, and we look forward to working with her in the coming year.

After four years as Chair, I will step aside this December to remain as a committee member, and the Chair's role will also rotate across the committee membership following the same approach being taken to the Secretary. Our hope is that over the next 12 months we will develop a pool

of expertise that can take the committee forward over the coming years. My thanks go to Tracey Gray for her support as Deputy Chair over the past year and to all committee members who have made such great strides in modernising the organisation of the Hall and its growing list of events and private bookings.




